Francis Rothluebber, who served as the sixth President of School Sisters of St. Francis, died in Rockford, IL, on Aug. 13, 2025, at the age of 103. Alma Marie Rothluebber was born Feb. 14, 1922, in St. Libory, NE, the 4th of 10 children to Effie and William Rothluebber. She was received into the School Sisters of St. Francis on June 13, 1938, and was given the name Sister Francis Borgia. She is survived by her brother Hop of Norfolk NE and her sister Alvina of Sturgis, SD, as well as by several nieces, nephews and cousins; many friends; and by the School Sisters of St. Francis, with whom she ministered for more than half a century. As Sister Francis Borgia, she began her teaching ministry in Milwaukee in 1942 followed by two decades of service as teacher and principal at Alvernia High School in Chicago. In 1966, Francis was elected as President of School Sisters of St. Francis, leading this worldwide congregation of more than 3,600 professed sisters across the US, Europe, and Central America during the cultural and religious shifts of the mid 20th century. In May 1972, the international delegates unanimously re-elected her to the SSSF presidency and she was also elected to a 3-year presidential term with the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR). Her leadership of LCWR influenced the renewal of religious life in many US congregations. Later, Francis ministered as a lecturer, workshop leader and spiritual director in Milwaukee (1976-1985) and then as founder of Columbiere Center (now known as Spirit Mountain Retreat Center) in Idyllwild, CA. In 1994, Francis received dispensation from her religious vows but remained a lifelong friend of the community and her sisters. Author of numerous books, articles, and multimedia presentations, Francis continued to write into her late 90s. She also founded New Momentum for Human Unity and created an award-winning 2009 documentary film "City of the Dawn" spotlighting the southern Indian city of Auroville. After an injury late last year, Francis moved to Rockford, IL, where she received care at the home of a friend and the services of Northern Illinois Hospice Association.

Following today's liturgy, there will be an evening gathering of friends at Sacred Heart Center (next door to St. Joseph Center) to celebrate Francis' life and legacy. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made in Francis' name to a religious or charitable organization of your choice. A service and interment will be held in Idyllwild, CA at Spirit Mountain Retreat Center on September 24, 2025.
