You Made a Forever Difference Meeting Basic Needs

Our foundresses based the School Sisters of St. Francis' mission on the belief that "the needs of the times are the will of God." Since the congregation's inception, our sisters have worked to meet the needs of people in all walks of life, all over the world, especially the poor.

This year, you made a difference by providing funding for:

CLEAN WATER for sisters ministering in Songea, Tanzania—an area known for severe water shortages during the region's dry season. The sisters installed a water well that provides clean water for drinking, cooking, and household chores. It will also supply the formation house that the sisters are building, which will train young women who aspire to be consecrated as sisters in our community.



FOOD SUPPLIES that sustain 110

families living in impoverished and underserved neighborhoods in Juarez, Mexico. Each month, packages of staples like rice, dried beans, canned food, cooking oil, and more, delivered by our sisters at Casa Alexia, our mission on the border, provide desperately needed nutrition to people who have limited access to income or health care. Your gifts also support our sisters' religious education classes for young people whose faith and sacramental life offer them a beacon of hope amidst poverty and political turmoil.

A MINIVAN that will enable our sisters to expand and enhance their ministries in a school and parish in Paita, Peru. Two-thirds of the city's 180,000 residents have no access to electricity or running water and are in desperate need of basic services.



A VITAL MEANS OF CONNECTION

Paita is a busy seaport on the Pacific Ocean, but ironically has a harsh desert climate and in many years receives virtually no rainfall. Its residents rely heavily on the boom-or-bust fishing, and many families receive very little pay for this dangerous, difficult work.

Our sisters who teach at St. Clare School and minister at a local parish serve many of these people's educational, pastoral, and healthcare needs. One day, the sisters may be transporting a pregnant woman to the hospital for a prenatal medical appointment; the next day, they may bring critical medical supplies from the airport to local parishes. The sisters will use the van daily to transport school teachers to conferences, help residents get emergency medical care, and travel to remote coastal fishing villages to teach children who might otherwise receive no formal instruction in the Catholic faith.

You Made a Forever Difference Through Education

Education has been the cornerstone of the School Sisters of St. Francis' mission since our first sisters began ministering nearly 150 years ago. Our foundresses Mother Alexia, Mother Alfons, and Sister Clara travelled from Germany to rural Wisconsin to teach immigrant children the "three Rs," and the tenets of the Catholic faith.

This year, you made a difference by providing funding for:

SCHOLARSHIPS for girls from isolated Indian farming villages. Making financial aid available to the girls who live at Maria Sadan Hostel in Bichhiya, India, opens up a world of opportunity for children like Manesha, who otherwise would be unable to attend high school or even grade school.

THE SAFETY AND WELLBEING

of children attending Mother Alexia School in Chayyoth, India. The installation of a new roof over the kindergarten wing means the school's youngest students now have a protected, comfortable classroom to begin their academic experience.

A NURTURING LEARNING

ENVIRONMENT for students St. Francis School in Budni, India. Thanks to our sisters, St. Francis's enrollment has more than quadrupled in the past decade. But the school's playground was not big enough to accommodate this rapid growth, and also flooded quickly during the rainy season, leaving the school with nowhere to hold physical education classes.

By expanding and re-landscaping the playground, the school now has a place for the children to exercise and play year round, helping the students to flourish physically, mentally, and socially.





A REASON TO HAVE HOPE

Thirteen-year-old Manisha Bhargav grew up in a rural village about 80 miles from Bichhiya. When she was eight, Manisha's father became ill and was no longer able to support the family. Manisha and her younger sister were accepted at Maria Sadan Hostel and began attending the diocesan school nearby.

When our sisters met Manisha and observed her outgoing nature, punctuality, and conscientiousness, they realized they had a future leader on their hands. With their guidance, Manisha has developed a love for reading and she now spends many hours of her free time in the library. The sisters tell us that Manisha's scholarship has given her a reason to have hope in her life, and her dream now is to become a journalist.






Funding Our Mission
